Last week we celebrated and acknowledged National Reconciliation week. It is our College tradition to acknowledge and gather on the land of the Kaurna people. This Reconciliation Week seeks to build on the respectful relationships shared by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people and other Australians. The date of National Reconciliation Week represents significant moments in the country's history. May 27 marks the anniversary of the 1967 referendum when Australians voted to remove clauses in the Australian Constitution that discriminated against Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This year is significant as it is 50 years since that historic moment. The historic Mabo decision was made on June 3 1992. This decision was particularly significant as it saw the official recognition of native title claims. This year's theme 'Let's take the next steps' is about a chance for everyone to take some fresh action to spark a change in our school or community - no matter how big or small. Reconciliation lives in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we are inspired to take the next steps forward.



Feast Day of St Marcellin Champagnat

On Tuesday 6 June we celebrated the Feast Day of St Marcellin Champagnat. This day is the anniversary of his death and was a special occasion for us in a year when we also celebrate 200 years since the establishment of the Marist Institute by Marcellin Champagnat. Our prayers are especially with the wonderful Marist brothers who continue to work in many facets of our community both in Australia and in the World. We also pray for the extensive Marist communities across the World and especially in education. As a special focus in this bicentennial year, four paintings were commissioned depicting four different Marist stories.

Mr Steve Byrne, Principal of Sacred Heart College, Adelaide (a Marist school) presented the College with four upright stands of these four paintings. Together with Sacred Heart College, Marcellin Technical College and Cardijn College we are continuing our celebrations of being Marist and uphold a wonderful tradition at Cardijn in honouring our founding principal Br Walter Smith AM FMS, who was an inspirational leader at Cardijn College and Sacred Heart College.

This exchange has now journeyed 31 years and continues to be one of the hallmark events in the life of the College. Whilst healthy competition in sports is important it is the wonderful relationship that the two Colleges have established that most people remember and value. Students are billeted by host families some living as far away as Naracoorte and Millicent. The experience of students from a regional country town mixing with students from a suburban city school is a unique feature of this exchange. Wonderful friendships are developed and much is shared in both contexts. It is always very difficult to win the exchange as the away team and this year was no different. The Tenison Woods College team was simply too strong on the day, but our students tried their very best to do their school proud.

NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK 2017



Last week was National Reconciliation Week. As a school we reflected on two significant anniversaries in our nation's reconciliation journey - 50 years since the 1967 referendum and 25 years since the historic Mabo decision. Each year National Reconciliation Week celebrates and builds on the respectful relationships shared by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and other Australians. It is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can join the national reconciliation journey.

27 May 1967 – the referendum that saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the census.

3 June 1992 – the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, which recognised that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have a special relationship with the land. This paved the way for land rights or Native Title.

A group of students from Cardijn and Marcellin attended the Aboriginal Veterans Commemorative Service on Friday at the Torrens Parade ground. The photo shows students with Mickey 'Kumatpi Marrutya" O'Brien, a Kaurna elder who presented the Welcome to Country and Smoking ceremony. The students were outstanding in the way they showed respect for our armed forces veterans and represented students from Catholic Schools in South Australia.

ITALIAN: FESTA DELLA REPUBBLICA



On Friday 2 June, Cardijn College celebrated Festa Della Repubblica. La Festa Della Repubblica is a national celebration of the day Italians voted on which form of government they wanted their country to have after the fall of Fascism. Over 12 million votes were for Italy to become a republic, with only 10 million Italians voting for the monarchy. This then caused the descendants of the House of Savoy (the Italian royal family) to be sent into exile.

Celebrating this day at Cardijn is important because Italian is one of the two languages studied, and it gives students the opportunity to interact with their language study outside of the classroom. By participating in Italian cultural activities, students realise that even if learning Italian grammar and speaking in Italian is not their strong point, participating in cultural activities demonstrates an acceptance and understanding of other cultures. It is also an opportunity for students to realise that

governments do not always remain the same, and referendums can occur successfully when people are willing to stand for what they believe is right.

Cardijn celebrated by having whole school prayer over the loudspeaker in Italian, gelato, pizza and pasta for sale, Scopa in the library and Italian music playing in the amphitheatre. Staff were also treated to an Italian morning tea. Thank you to the staff and students who participated in this special day.


