The Cardijn College community is a significant member of Catholic Education South Australia's (CESA) more than 100 schools, especially across the Southern Vales of Adelaide.



Our Cardijn Way fosters a culture of belonging and aspiration. We work in partnership to encourage, enable, and support students, families, and staff to live faithfully and with integrity.

We do this in the context of three unique campuses: Marian (Years 7 – 12, Noarlunga Downs), Marcellin (Trade Training Years 10-12 and Apprentices, Christie Downs) and Galilee (Reception – Year 9, Aldinga). Cardijn offers multiple, inclusive and diverse pathways in alignment with a foundational tenet that there is **Unity in Diversity!**




CONTEXT

Cardijn College has established a tradition of personal and communal excellence across its holistic and diverse educational pathways since its foundation in 1984.

Significant moments from the past forty years:

- Br Walter Smith, a Marist Brother, is appointed principal in 1983 and works with the interim board to propose the College's name as 'Cardijn College'. The 'Young Christian Workers' or the YCW movement as founded by Cardinal Joseph Cardijn, initially in Belgium, was very influential across the world, including the Adelaide parishes. Some of the board members had met Cardinal Cardijn when he visited Adelaide, and this had a profound impact on their lives.
- From humble beginnings and at the behest of the families of the Southern Vales, the College has grown to become a leading multi-campus College with multiple learning pathways and excellent staff and facilities.
- An enduring commitment to the College Motto See, Judge, Act!
- Outstanding inclusive practices and facilities to cater for the special needs of our students in 'The Marist Centre' and more recently 'The Lavalla Centre' (Marian Campus), as well as the support programs at Marcellin and Galilee.

- In 2018 Marcellin Technical College becomes a campus of Cardijn providing industry standard vocational training opportunities for not just Cardijn students but for all students of the region.
- In 2023 Galilee Catholic Primary School formally amalgamates with the College following a period of transition from CESA.
- In 2023 the Noarlunga Downs campus is formally named 'Marian' to honour our 'Marist' heritage. The College now comprises of the Galilee, Marcellin and Marian Campuses.
- Responding to the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic and slowly but surely reestablishing learning routines and aspirational standards across the three campuses.
- The support from the local community has been such that Cardijn is nearing full enrolment across each site and our enrolment across the College in 2024 is over 2000 students. A far cry from Day one, 1984 when just over 100 students commenced.
- Strategic land purchases by Catholic Education South Australia at Noarlunga Downs and Aldinga will see the development of a Senior School at Marian and a gradual growth of the Middle and Senior School facilities at Galilee.

- e. Continue to develop an authentic and contemporary expression and renewal of our invitation to faith, including a focus on ecological conversion, solidarity with the marginalised and undertaking 'faith in action' projects.

2. Our Learning and Teaching

- a. Implement and demonstrate high quality curriculum, contemporary pedagogy, assessment and reporting practices consistently across the College.
- b. Further develop school wide approaches to promote equity and excellence within an inclusive learning program with multiple pathways.

a context of increasing enrolments and complexities, including leadership structures.

- c. Resource and further develop support and coaching for Early Career Teachers (ECTs)
- d. Retain and support 'Relief' staff across the College.
- e. Ensure adequate and professional resourcing, including professional learning opportunities for all College staff.
- f. Provide leadership formation and mentoring opportunities for our current, newly appointed, and emerging leaders.

5. Our Community

- a. Ensure celebration and acknowledgement of achievements across the Cardijn Family
- b. Further develop partnerships with families and the broader Southern Vales community, especially our parish partner schools.
- c. Consult with our families as to their parenting needs regarding prevailing youth issues.
- d. Expand our industry and employment partnerships to provide post school vocational pathways.

e. Provide access to meaningful and relevant volunteering and community building activities including College Board and Committees, Campus projects, presentations to students, staff and parent/carers.

6. Our Stewardship and Improvement

- a. Continue to develop and complete a bold plan for the College!
- b. Complete and Implement Master
 Plans for 'Marian West' and 'Galilee
 South' Campuses
- c. Review and refine the '10 Year Financial Plan' and the '10 Year Maintenance Plan' to ensure continued sustainability and continual upgrading of College infrastructure and resources.
- d. Seek funding opportunities with government and community bodies to further enhance Cardijn's facilities and joint use, out of hours access for local groups.
