### **Subject Description**

The Certificate I in Hospitality is a semester-long course run by AIOH with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day per week at Cardijn College – Marian Campus in the Commercial Kitchen. Students develop the required skills and experience to pursue further training or work in hospitality settings including restaurants, hotels, motels, caterers, clubs, pubs, cafés and delicatessens. Specific skills and knowledge include: knife handling, precision cuts, preparation of simple dishes, working effectively with others, hygienic practices, and WHS. The delivery model involves the face-to-face training of practical skills in addition to online theory. This course is a full-fee course for Year 10s and 11s. A completed Certificate I can contribute towards Stage 1 SACE Credits.

### **Subject Description**

The Certificate II in Salon Assistant is a full-year course run by Clipjoint Education with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day a week at Cardijn College – Marcellin Campus. This course is recognised as an entry level qualification for the hairdressing industry, preparing students to effectively work as salon assistants under the direct supervision of a qualified hairdresser. Students develop knowledge and skills in shampooing, colouring, blow-drying, braiding and up styles, maintaining hairdressing tools, scheduling appointments, recommending and selling products, and applying workplace health and safety. Year 10s must enrol as full-fee students, whilst eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate II can contribute towards Stage 1 SACE Credits.

### Subject Description

The Certificate III in Beauty Services is a full-year course run by Media Makeup with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day per week at Cardijn College – Marcellin Campus. Students develop the skills and confidence to provide a range of beauty and make up services to clients. Make up knowledge and skills include the fundamentals to provide event makeup services such as Photographic Makeup and Bridal Makeup. Students also develop skills and knowledge in lash extensions and tinting, brow tinting and shaping, waxing services, spray tanning and manicure & pedicure services including gel nails. This course is a full-fee course for Year 10s and 11s. A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

This course is a full-fee course for Year 10s and 11s. A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

### Subject Description

The Certificate III Game Design Fundamentals is a full-year course run by AIE with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day per week at Cardijn College – Marian Campus. Students develop the skills to import art, write scripts, design and refine gameplay mechanics and utilise popular game development software to create a playable game from concept to demo. Specific concepts taught include; defining and developing game mechanics, game design documentation, rapid prototyping, creating interactive environments, and utilising process feedback to refine game design. There is no prior programming knowledge required to study this course. Year 10s must enrol as full-fee students, whilst eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

The Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care is a full-year course run by Queensford College with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day a week at Cardijn College – Marcellin Campus, in addition, students must also complete 160 hours of structured work placement. Students will develop the skills, knowledge, and experience to work in childcare centres and OSHC providers. Completion of this qualification is the minimum formal training required to work as a qualified childcare worker. Specific concepts taught include the supporting of children's behaviour and development, organising work priorities, healthy food and drink preparation, hygienic practices, responding to young people at risk, WHS, and working within the *Early Years Learning* and other legal and ethical frameworks. Year 10s must enrol as full-fee students, whilst eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

Students develop the required theoretical knowledge (principles of anatomy, nutrition, and physiology) and practical skills (conducting fitness assessments, designing and delivering exercise programs, and motivational strategies) to help clients achieve fitness goals. Graduates of the Certificate III in Fitness, will qualify for specialisation as a Group Exercise Instructor and Gym Instructor. This course is a full-fee course for Year 10s and 11s. A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

Specific concepts taught include; utilising C# to develop games in Unity 3D, implementing game mechanics, rapid prototyping, importing artwork assets, generating levels, special effects, designing user interfaces, game logic and managing projects using version control and collaboration tools. Year 10s must enrol as full-fee students, whilst eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

Specific skills and concepts taught include airbrushing, creative makeup, photographic makeup, special effects, and learning how to establish themselves in the industry as a Freelance Makeup Artist. Eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

Year 10s must enrol as full-fee students, whilst eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

This qualification is an entry point for an Apprenticeship Pathway in the Automotive industry. Eligible Year 11 students may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate II can contribute towards Stage 1 SACE Credits.

This qualification is an entry point for an Apprenticeship Pathway in many areas of the Construction industry. ### Subject Description

The Certificate III in Screen and Media is a full-year course run by AIE with a January intake. Training is undertaken 1 day per week at Cardijn College – Marian Campus. Students develop the skills to create 3D environments, characters, and animation for interactive games. These skills are also transferable to fields such as architecture, product design, film making, virtual reality, and augmented reality. Specific skills taught include; concept art, 3D modelling, texturing, animation, lighting, grey boxing, adding audio, and creating animated game characters and interactive environments. Eligible Year 11s may gain access to SA Government course subsidies (see VET Coordinator for eligibility criteria). A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

### Subject Description

The Certificate III in Sports Coaching is a full-year course run by the Australian College of Sport with a January intake. Training is undertaken on a timetabled line at Cardijn College – Marian Campus. This course is an excellent pathway for students who have completed sporting academies in Year 10, and/or students who wish to become sports coaches in the community. Concepts, knowledge and skills developed in this qualification will also assist a student's preparation for SACE Stage 2 PE. Graduates of this course will be highly regarded for coaching roles at Cardijn College once they complete their SACE. This course is a full-fee course and is not subsidised by the SA Government. A completed Certificate III can boost a student's ATAR and contribute towards Stage 2 SACE Credits.

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### \*Other VET Qualifications

Cardijn College can support students in other VET qualifications, provided the delivery hours/methods are not prohibitive for a student's timetable and the course is delivered by a registered RTO on the Australian Qualifications Framework. If the course you wish to study is not listed above, please make an appointment to speak with VET Pathways Coordinator - Matt Kempson in the Pathways Hub. Examples of courses that students have completed include; Certificate III in Dance, Certificate III in Music, Certificate III in Assistant Dance Teaching, Certificate III in Nail Technology, Certificate III in Horse Care, Certificate II in Plumbing (Pre-Apprenticeship), Certificate II in Marine Operations, Certificate III in Legal Services, and the Certificate III in Visual Arts.
