#### **SACE REQUIREMENTS:**

To successfully meet the requirements of the SACE, students must complete at least 10 credits (1 semester) of Numeracy and 20 credits (2 semesters) of Literacy at Stage 1. These come from the Mathematics and English choices at Year 11.

All Year 11 students will be automatically enrolled in AIF for a semester. This is a compulsory component of the SACE and students must achieve a C- grade or higher.

All Year 11 students will automatically be enrolled in Religious Education and Thrive for the full year, as these are compulsory subjects at Cardijn College.
