

Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation AUR20720

COURSE DESCRIPTION & PATHWAYS

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who perform a limited range of tasks relating to identifying and inspecting mechanical and electrical components and systems of light vehicles, heavy vehicles, outdoor power equipment, bicycles, marine craft and motorcycles.

This qualification also covers the skills and knowledge required to perform minor maintenance and repair of an automotive vehicle body. The range of technical skills and knowledge is limited.

VET for School Students – (VSS)

The AUR20720 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation is supported by the Government of South Australia and is available for eligible VSS Students.

To be eligible for access to a subsidised training place, a school student must meet the following criteria.

They must be:

- An Australian or New Zealand citizen or,
- A permanent Australian resident or,
- An eligible visa holder
- Reside in South Australia

They must also be:

- enrolled in Year 11, 12 or 13 and be 16 years of age or turning 16 years of age in the current year of that enrolment, and
- undertaking SACE or equivalent and,
- have completed a preparatory VET pathway – please refer, VET for School Students Approved Evidence for Completion of a Relevant VET Pathway Guide, (available from your VET Coordinator).

Whilst at school the secondary school student can access a total of one Certificate II course and one Certificate III course. If a secondary school student completes 70% of a course and exits without completion, they will consume one of their course entitlements.

Acceptance into a subsidised course will be determined through the VET Readiness Orientation process (VETRO). This will occur following receipt of a completed VET for School Student Referral to Training Form from the secondary school.
